### Admissions

- ◆ Loveless Academic Magnet Program (LAMP) is a public academic magnet high school.
- ◆ Current enrollment is 504 in grades 9 through 12.
- ◆ The number of graduates in the class of 2018 will be 112.
- ◆ Admission is open without regard to race, sex, religion, or creed and is open to students residing in Montgomery County, previously attending public or private schools, and who meet the admission requirements.
- ◆ Admission criteria is highly selective and only students with the best academic credentials are accepted. Grades, standardized test scores, academic records, and discipline records are the basis for acceptance.
- ◆ As a reflection of the high academic ability of the select group of students, rank within the class is not given.
- ◆ LAMP is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
